Bankruptcy

On June 27, 2011 the Receiver assigned Caliber into Bankruptcy pursuant to an Order of the Court of Queen's Bench of Alberta.

Secured Creditors

\$17,406,696.32 has been distributed to Caliber's secured creditors. The only remaining secured creditor with an interest in future realizations from the receivership is Servus Credit Union Ltd. ("Servus"). Based on the estimated realizations from the remaining Caliber property, Servus will suffer a significant shortfall on its indebtedness.

Unsecured Creditors

A list of creditors was obtained from the books and records of Caliber, a copy of which was included in the 245/246 report filed April 12, 2011.

Plan of Action

- T4s and ROEs and letters explaining the *Wage Earner Protection Program Act* ("WEPPA") procedure were sent to all employees of Caliber on April 14, 2011. As of today's date 85% of the former employees had received their eligible WEPPA payments.
- Employment Insurance has provided information regarding overpayments and final WEPPA cheques have been prepared and will be mailed this month.
- The Receiver continues its efforts to collect outstanding accounts receivable balances relating to non-bonded contracts, inter-company receivables and investments.
- An offer on the gravel pit has been received and is awaiting court approval.
- A copy of the Statement of Receipts and Disbursements for the period April 1, 2011 to September 30, 2012 is attached as Schedule A to this report.
- The status of Caliber will be updated periodically on our website www.pwc.com/car-calibersystems.
- The Receiver has engaged independent counsel, Mr. Howard Gorman with Norton Rose Canada LLP.
