REVISED NOTICE OF CONSTITUTIONAL QUESTION

TAKE NOTICE that the Petitioners intend to challenge the constitutional applicability of the *Environmental Management Act*, S.B.C. 2003, c. 53 and any regulations promulgated thereunder (the "EMA") to the matters in issue in these proceedings.

AND FURTHER TAKE NOTICE that the constitutional challenge will be argued at the hearing of the Petitioners' application to sanction the Plan of Arrangement and Compromise filed by the Petitioners (the "Sanction Hearing"). The Sanction Hearing is scheduled to take place on May 7, 2012.

Particulars of the point to be argued are as follows:

1. Pursuant to Section 91(21) of the *Constitutional Act, 1867*, the federal Parliament has exclusive legislative jurisdiction over the subject matter of bankruptcy and insolvency. In the exercise of that jurisdiction, Parliament has enacted the *Companies Creditors Arrangement Act*, R.S.C. 1985, c. C-36 (the "CCAA").
2. By virtue of the doctrine of paramountcy, provincial laws are inoperable to the extent that they conflict with the CCAA. A provincial law conflicts with the CCAA where, *inter alia*, compliance with the provincial law would:
 - (a) frustrate the purpose of the CCAA or would interfere with or limit the authority of the Court to make any order which is aimed at achieving the objects of the CCAA; and/or
 - (b) alter the scheme of priorities under the CCAA.
3. The present proceedings are brought pursuant to the CCAA.
4. The Petitioners have obtained an Order approving a procedure for the Petitioners' creditors to prove their claims against the Petitioners (the "Claims Procedure Order"). In addition, the Petitioners have filed with this Court, on March 22, 2012, a Plan of Arrangement and Compromise (the "Plan"), and have obtained an order for a meeting of the Petitioners' creditors to vote on the Plan (the "Meetings Order").
5. The Petitioners intend to apply to the Court for an Order sanctioning the Plan and implementing, *inter alia*, the Meetings Order and the Claims Procedure Order (the "Sanction Order").
6. The CCAA vests the Court with the jurisdiction to make the Meetings Order and the Claims Procedure Order, to authorize a vote on the Plan and to issue the Sanction Order.

7. The Petitioners intend to rely at the Sanction Hearing upon the provisions of the CCAA generally and in particular upon section 11.8 of the CCAA.

8. To the extent that the EMA is inconsistent with or would limit the authority of the Court to grant the Sanction Order or otherwise implement the restructuring contemplated by the Plan, the EMA is rendered inoperable by virtue of the doctrine of paramountcy.

9. Further, or in the alternative, to the extent that the EMA is inconsistent with the provisions of the CCAA or would alter the scheme of priorities under the CCAA, the EMA is rendered inoperable by virtue of the doctrine of paramountcy.
