ORDER

Before the Honourable Mr. Justice Robert M. Hall

UPON IT APPEARING that Gillis Truckways Inc. has applied for an order for repossession of a JC 50 ton tri-axle detachable trailer (S/N 2J9J7A34R42K001061) in the possession of Hickman Equipment (1985) Limited under a demand for repossession given pursuant to section 81.1(1) of the *Bankruptcy and Insolvency Act*;

IT IS ORDERED AND DECLARED THAT the claim of the applicant for repossession pursuant to section 81.1(1) of the *Bankruptcy and Insolvency Act* is valid and that the Receiver is directed to permit the applicant to repossess the said trailer.

Applications with respect to the costs allocation plan are enlarged sine die with leave of the parties to apply or to agree and to file a consent order.

There shall be no order for costs in the application.
