The City of Golden Friendship

Known for its vast rivers that yielded gold nuggets in centuries past, Cagayan De Oro is now the premier gateway of Northern Mindanao's commerce and industry. As the capital city of Misamis Oriental province, Cagayan de Oro is home to more than 600,000 Kagay-anons who are known to be hospitable, warm, and welcoming, hence its distinction as the "City of Golden Friendship".

Growing economic progress

Cagayan de Oro's access to regional and foreign markets presents golden opportunities to investors inside and outside the country. The city's abundant natural and man-made resources have made it much easier for economic progress to sprout within its borders. In 2014, it has been ranked by the National Competitiveness Council as the second most competitive city in the Philippines after Makati City, the country's premier financial district.

The city is at a new frontier in its economic progress as business establishments from outside its borders are coming its way. Known as the melting pot of Mindanao, Cagayan de Oro continues to take pride in its accessibility, business growth, and attractions.

The adventure never ends

While the city is becoming a commercial hub in the region, much of it is still preserved for its innate natural resources. This makes Cagayan de Oro an attractive tourist destination. The city is home to many extreme sports activities one can enjoy with the warmth of its people.

Cagayan de Oro has opened a myriad of adventures for travelers. It was featured on the *TTG Show Daily*, the official publication of the ASEAN Tourism Forum. With the city's tourism tagline – *the adventure never ends* – it offers a variety of tourist spots ranging from adventure parks, caves, and historical places to the latest paragliding and parasailing adventures.



CDO's milieu

Cagavan de Oro has evolved from a little city in Mindanao to a bustling modern city with tremendous economic and business opportunities for prospective investors.

The Limketkais and the Gaisanos took turns at opening their big malls along CM Recto in 1989 and 1990. When McDonald's and Jollibee opened at Limketkai Center, Kagay-anon kids were then the happiest and the jolliest around.

The largest structural progress in Cagayan de Oro for 2017 is the opening of the SM CDO Downtown Premier on 12 May 2017. The mall is the second SM Supermall in Northern Mindanao and 61st mall of the SM Group in the Philippines. Much is also anticipated when the SM BPO Tower becomes integrated with the retail center of the mall. This will open opportunities to the already sprouting BPO industry within the city.

Real estate developments are also prevalent as new condominium units, hotels, theme parks, and resorts are being cascaded for construction such as the Avida Towers Aspira, New Dawn Hotel Plus, The Loop North Tower, MesaVerte Residences, Primavera City, One Oasis Cagayan de Oro, Hugo Skye Lounge, Montierra, Seven Seas Waterpark and Resort, and Cove Garden Resort.






Per capita index, Northern Mindanao vs Philippines (2014-2016, at constant 2000 prices)






Northern Mindanao is supported by a relatively low inflation rate.




From one place to another



The province of Misamis Oriental is a paradise where nature-tripping is a neverending possibility. Located along the northern coast of the Mindanao Island, it is bounded on the north by Macajalar Bay, Iligan Bay on the west, Bukidnon and Lanao del Norte on the south and southwest, and on the east by Agusan del Norte.

Cagayan de Oro has long been known as an adventure city. There are a number of creeks and rivers that run through the city. On the southern portion, hills, gorges, plateaus, and the mountain ranges of Bukidnon province dominate the scenery. With its famed whitewater rafting and kayaking adventures, nature treks at Mapawa, and jump-off points to major zip lining thrills in the region, CDO certainly demands that one be outdoors!



Mapawa Nature Park is a vast property abundant with magnificent waterfalls, imposing views, and exciting activities nestled in the forest park of Barangay Cugman. Attractions include a 20-ft high water slide, 25-ft high cliff jump, and 65-ft rappel, which offer tourists a unique river trekking and canyoneering experience.




Paragliding is CDO's first aerial adventure. This gives sky riders a breathtaking view of Mother Nature's lush greens, a view of CDO's river to the west and a bit of the city's skyline in the north. A full view of Camiquin Island can also be seen.



Known as the **Whitewater Rafting Capital** of the Philippines, CDO is the only city in the country that offers rafting year-round. Its river depth, incline, and rock formations make rafting in the Cagayan de Oro River a fun and exciting experience. Enthusiasts can select from several whitewater rafting operators and choose the level of thrill they seek from 'beginner' to 'advanced' to 'extreme'.



Named after the former governor of Misamis Oriental (formerly Gen. Douglas MacArthur Park), it is located right in front of the Provincial Capitol. It includes the Heritage Monument and Press Freedom Monument.



Business One Stop Shop (BOSS) mechanism

Cagayan de Oro has established its Business One Stop Shop (BOSS) mechanism in 2010 to ease the business permit registration and renewal system for the transacting public.



processing time in registering business permits through the BOSS mechanism

Fiscal incentives

- Exemption from local licenses, fees, and dues within three years from the start date of the business operation
- Exemption from business tax for not more than six years starting from the approval date of husiness
- Exemption from RPT
- Exemption from RPT for Information and Communications Technology (ICT) equipment and other related facilities

All applicants shall pay a non-refundable filing fee of PH₱1,000.00 to the City Treasurer's Office.

- Online billing and payment for business applications (new and renewal), business permits, and real property tax


The Valley of Gold

El Dorado it was called in a poem by Edgar Allan Poe. The valley of gold, similar to the Holy Grail, was the place many warriors and pioneers set out to find-and call home. The people of CDO feel just as fortunate to be living in a valley so blessed with sunlight, so abundant with water. It is, just as well, a matter of concern in the 21st century, as global warming makes water levels rise. However, this predicament is also an opportunity for anyone whose expertise is in tunnel and ocean engineering.

Protecting the flow

Underwater tunnel engineering is more than a hundred years old. There are enough local experts and key Filipino engineers away from the Philippines who are well-acquainted with this centuryold technology that's so essential to mass transport and people movement. London's first underwater and pedestrian tunnel from Rotherithe in South London to Limehouse in North London was completed by 1902. The year 1928 was the last year the streets of London were flooded by the River Thames: finally, the moving flood barrier structure at the mouth of the Thames River in Woolwich was completed.

The mouth of the Cagayan de Oro Bay is wide enough to be inundated by a deluge during the rainy season, but too narrow by the shore for this deluge to subside. A massive flood-control seawall could be a flood solution. With a sound public



and private sector arrangement, Filipino ingenuity can perfect flood control systems most appropriate for this country, where an average of 25 typhoons visit its territory every year.



The city stands

In the meantime, better sewage systems and waste management all over the metropolis would ensure public health and safety from canal bacteria. So while Cagayan de Oro invites property developers to build more skyscrapers and better visible urban infrastructure, forthcoming investments in tunnel and ocean engineering will concentrate upon managing the city's depths.

A seawall will keep the deluge at bay, while the economic deluge of Cagayan de Oro—with its low unemployment levels and high-achieving residents—can carry on and flow.
