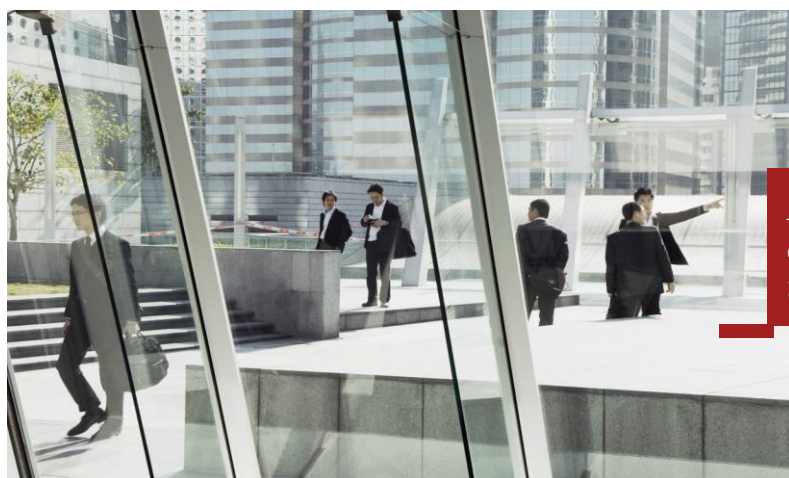

Most customs authorities expect informed oversight over LSPs and customs brokers.
