Law on State Land Cadastral

On 7 July 2011, the Parliament of Ukraine adopted the Law On State Land Cadastral (the "Law"). If the President signs the Law, many aspects of the Law will be effective starting from 1 January 2012.

The Land Cadastral is an information system which contains, among other things, data on ownership and use rights of land plots located within the state boundaries of Ukraine. It will be maintained by the State Agency of Land Resources of Ukraine.

In addition to regulating the operation of the Land Cadastral, the Law introduces the following changes:

- Land Title Certificates will no longer be issued starting from 1 January 2013; instead the title to land will be confirmed by an extract from the Register of Title to Immovable Property;
- Certain data from the Land Cadastral will be publicly available on the Internet.

Implementation of the Law will require adoption of a number of legislative acts.

We will continue to monitor and provide updates of further developments in this legislation.
