The PricewaterhouseCoopers (PwC) **Remelda Moxey** Scholarship is open to eligible Bahamian or Bahamian status holder students looking to forge a professional career path in Accounting. As a successful scholarship recipient, our Firm is committed to providing you with the necessary opportunities to help you with your career development. We create a pathway to success through financial assistance, mentorship, work experience and the opportunity to join a global firm that will expand your business acumen.

If you are a student looking for an opportunity to invest in your future and jumpstart your professional career, the PwC **Remelda Moxey** Scholarship could be the right opportunity for you!

The scholarship is awarded annually by the Firm to a student currently pursuing a Full Time undergraduate or graduate degree in Accounting; a student looking to start their tertiary education at an accredited institution in the Bahamas or abroad within the accounting discipline or a student interested in a career in public accounting. The scholarship amount will be disbursed at the beginning of each academic year.

Following a successful matriculation and attainment of a degree in Accounting, it is expected that the candidate must obtain one of the following certifications: Certified Public Accountant (CPA), Chartered Accountant (CA) or Association of Chartered Certified Accountants (ACCA).

The candidate must also be well rounded, as evidenced by community involvement, sporting or extra-curricular activities and is of good character and integrity.

What are scholarship recipients offered?



Recipients will be awarded the following:

- 1 \$10,000 scholarship at the undergraduate level for local colleges and/or universities, \$15,000 scholarship at the graduate level for local universities and up to \$15,000 scholarship for overseas universities
- 2 Valuable work experience in PwC's internship/co op programs during the Summer, and Easter breaks will be expected, as agreed
- 3 Ongoing career coaching and support including one – on – one contact with your own individual PwC Professional coach
- 4 The opportunity to work part time with the firm during your senior year and/or full time after graduation and embark on a challenging and rewarding career



Who should apply?



Successful candidates must meet the following criteria:

1. A Bahamian or Bahamian status holder student who is:
 - a. Currently enrolled at an accredited college or university in your second year or lower with a cumulative grade point average of GPA to 3.30 or higher having obtained at least 5 BGCSE passes (including English and Mathematics) with a minimum grade of B in at least 5 subjects.
 - b. Currently enrolled at an accredited college or university in your third year or higher with a cumulative grade point average of GPA to 3.30 or higher
 - c. Possession of a high school diploma
2. A combined SAT score of not less than 1600 if taken prior to 5 March 2016, 1200 if taken after 5 March 2016, or a combined ACT score of 21 (if you studied abroad or sat locally)

Local or Overseas Study?

Local Study: You could be funded to complete a Bachelor's or Master's Degree in the Accountancy discipline at a local accredited tertiary institution.

Instances where candidates have not attained 150 hours at the Bachelor's degree level, you may apply for funding with us to attend an accredited university to complete the difference of the hours required to qualify for writing the Certified Public Accountant Examination.

Overseas Study: Applicants for sponsorship at this level are generally expected to be currently enrolled at a suitable university overseas or to have completed an Associate's degree in preparation.

In certain exceptional cases, PwC will consider applications from students attending university for the first time.

You can apply for a maximum of BS\$15,000 per year depending on the degree program.

When to apply?

Applications should be received by the first Friday in April each year. We will review all application packages and interview potential candidates in April with decisions to be made by mid-May. If you are not successful, you will receive a notification by mail or email.

You will be required to submit a detailed resume outlining your accomplishments to date including any work experience and anticipated date of completion.

Outline and provide evidence of highest achievement to date (A Levels, SAT, BGCSE, BJC, High School Diploma, Pitman's, etc.).

A copy of your Associates Degree certificate and most recent official transcript with a minimum cumulative grade point average (GPA) of 3:30

A copy of your Bachelor's Degree and most recent official transcript with a minimum cumulative grade point average (GPA) of 3:30

4

SAT/ACT score (if applicable)

Provide a brief overview of any community or sports involvement

7

Essay of no more than 1,500 words on the topic, "The **impact of technology** on doing business in The Business."

In addition to the above, packets should contain the following items:

-  1 Copy of passport or other proof of Bahamian or status holder citizenship
-  2 Two character references, including one from your Accounting professor
-  3 Passport sized color photograph
