USMCA Uniform Regulations published

In brief

The Uniform Regulations for USMCA, which will replace NAFTA, have been published in advance of the USMCA's entry into force on July 1, 2020. These Regulations provide detailed instructions for the implementation of the USMCA.

In detail

On June 3, 2020, the Uniform Regulations for the United States-Mexico-Canada Agreement (USMCA) were published. The Uniform Regulations will be applied starting July 1, when USMCA replaces NAFTA. They contain detailed instructions regarding rules of origin, which must be fulfilled in order to apply preferential duty rates, as well as origin certification procedures.

Compared to NAFTA, USMCA contains stricter rules of origin, particularly for automobiles and automotive parts. Businesses currently using NAFTA should check the USMCA text and Uniform Regulations as soon as possible in order to confirm that their goods will meet the USMCA rules of origin and confirm the required procedures for using USMCA.
