Briefly

On 23 April 2025 the Mazhilis approved the draft Law "On Amendments and Additions to Certain Legislative Acts of the Republic of Kazakhstan on Intellectual Property Issues" (the "**Draft Law**").

In details

The Draft Law, among others, provides for reduction in the time required for:

- preliminary examination of trademarks - from one month to 10 business days;
- full examination of trademarks – up to three months from the date of filing of application.

The Draft Law also introduces amendments to a number of legislative acts, including the Civil Code, the Law on "Copyright and Related Rights", and the Law on "Trademarks, Service Marks, Geographical Indications and Appellations of Origin".
