


Overview



Non-Tax Revenue for 23/24



SACU Receipts











Deficit Comparison (N\$ Millions)



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

Provisions are made for the upcoming Presidential, National Assembly and Regional, as well as Local Authorities Elections to be held in 2024 and beyond.

Allocations are made in the development budget to prioritise ongoing projects and projects contained in the second Harambee Prosperity Plan (HPP II).

Incorporating inflationary adjustments in the expenditure ceilings to keep up with rising costs of utilities and the general cost of living

New development projects are prioritized based on the gains on socio-economic impact

Tax Proposals



Reduce non-mining company tax rates to 31% effective in FY2024/25, and a further reduction to 30% in FY2025/26. The Tax Policy
