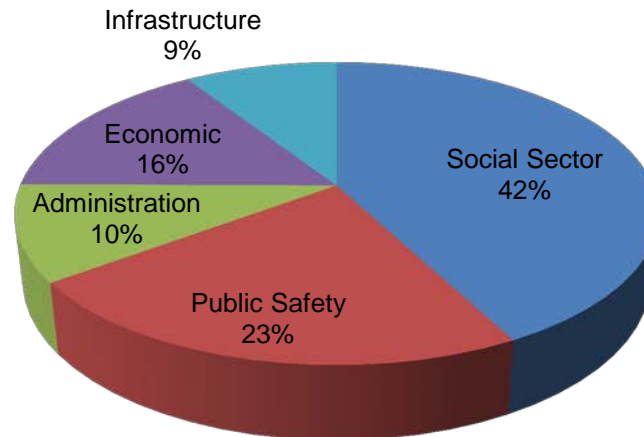

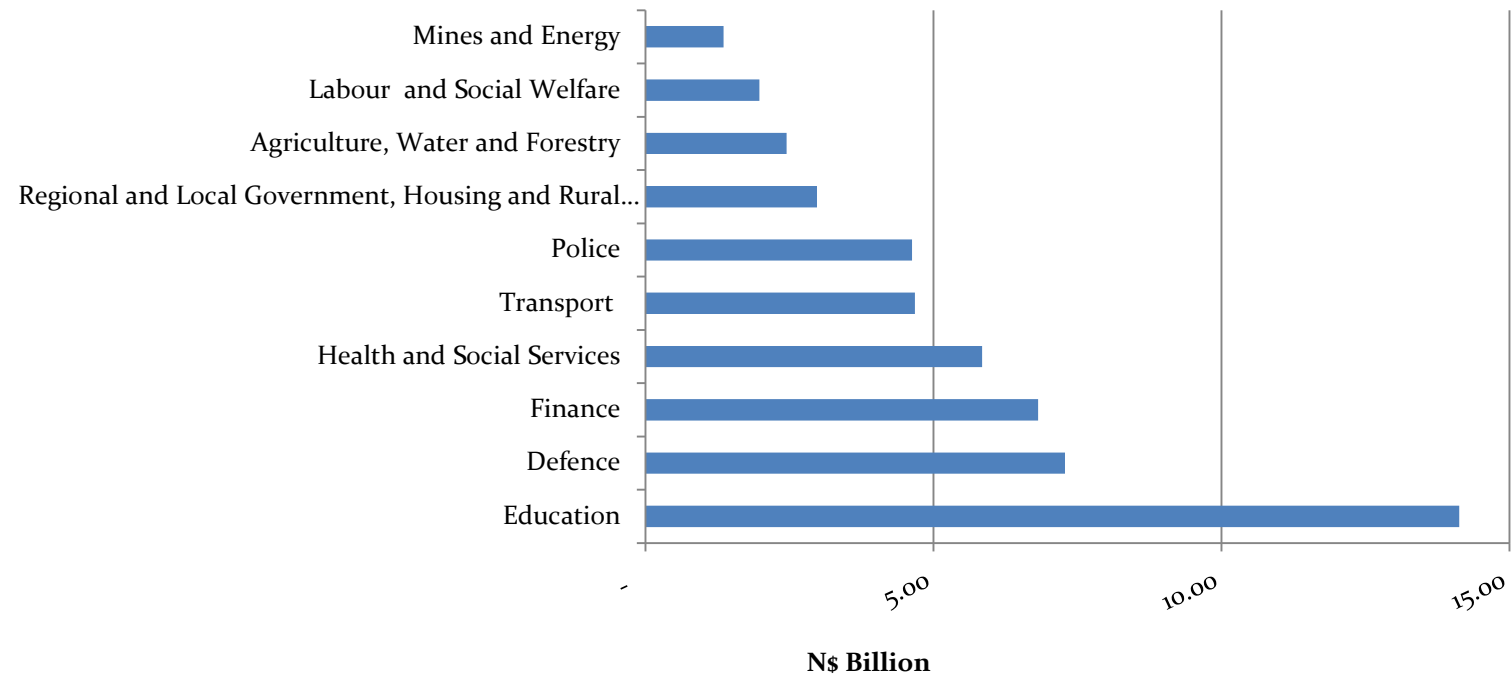

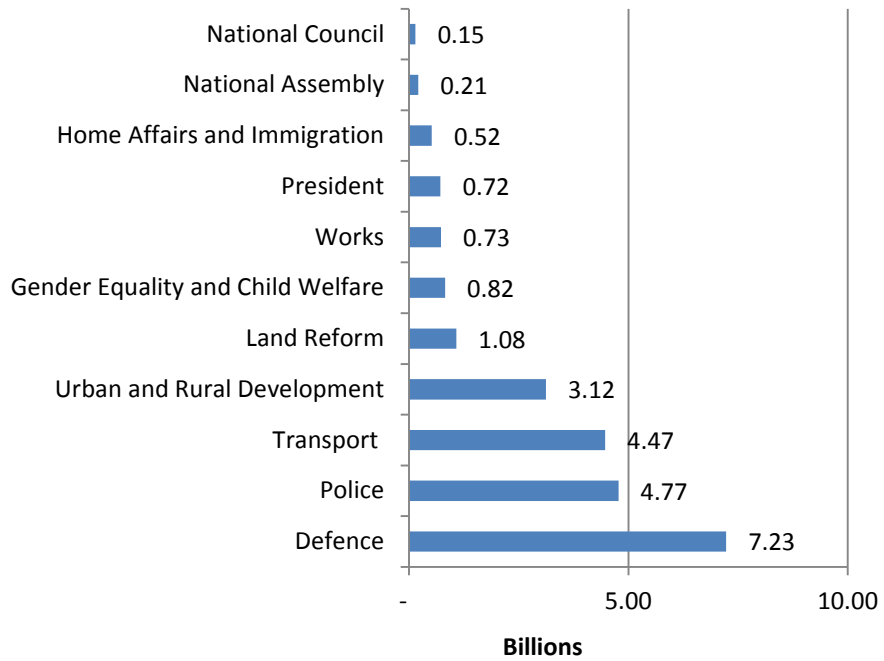

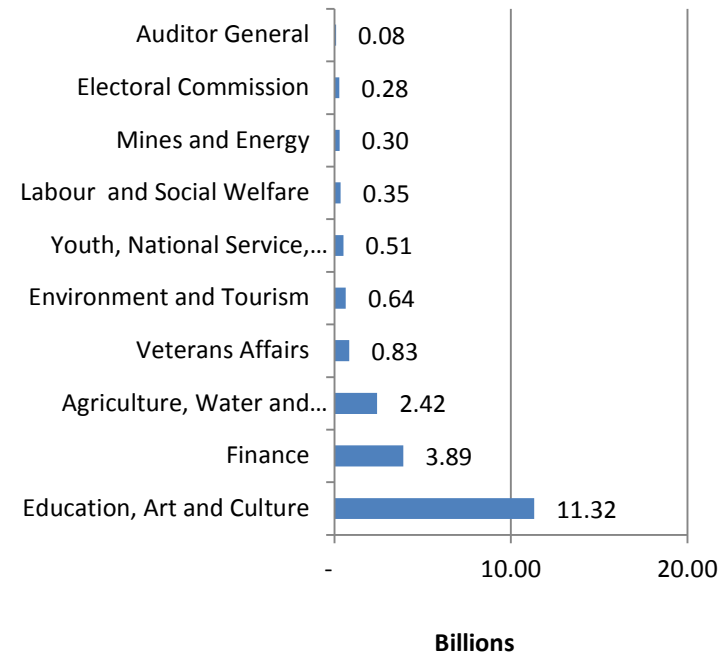
Top 10 Big Spender
