Update on export control measures of dual-use items

Summary :



On 17 October 2017, the Cabinet approved the principles of a new Ministry of Commerce (MOC) Notification re: Specifying dual-use items as goods requiring permission and being subject to export measures (No.2).

Following this Cabinet Resolution, it's now expected that MOC Notification No. 2 will revoke the original MOC Notification which was issued in October 2015, and which was originally scheduled to come into force on 1 January 2018.

Although the official MOC Notification No. 2 hasn't been published yet, it's understood that the implementation of export control measures for dual-use items (originally scheduled to be implemented on 1 January 2018) will be postponed and implemented from 1 January 2019 onwards.

More details will follow once the official MOC Notification is released. For more details on the export control measures, please refer to PwC Tax Insight # 11/2015, dated 4 December 2015.
