

At a glance...

On June 25, 2024, the Government issued Decree 69/2024/ND-CP on electronic identification and authentication (eID), requiring businesses in Vietnam to register a corporate eID account. The deadline for compliance with this requirement is June 30, 2025.



Content



On June 25, 2024, the Government issued Decree No. 69/2024/NĐ-CP on electronic identification and authentication (eID), which took effect on July 1, 2024. This decree is a key component of Vietnam's digital transformation strategy, requiring all businesses to register for an eID to access digital public services and comply with national standards on data security and authentication.

To register, businesses must provide certain information, including the full name and ID number of the legal representative or head of the organization, business registration number, tax code, organization ID, head office address, and date of establishment.

Effective July 1, 2025, existing accounts on the National Public Service Portal and other government platforms will be deactivated. Only eID accounts on the VNeID platform will be valid for accessing public services.

The legal representative, or an authorized individual thereof, can register either online via the VNeID app or website (<https://vneid.gov.vn>), or in person at their local police department. However, the representative must hold a Level-2 personal eID. While most Vietnamese nationals already possess this, foreign representatives typically do not and therefore may face difficulties in completing the registration.

As a result, companies with Vietnamese legal representatives who hold Level-2 eIDs should proceed with registration immediately. For those with foreign representatives, further instructions are pending. PwC Legal is actively engaging with the authorities on this matter and will provide updates as they become available.
